THE UPTOWN GARDENER Some by Ruth Herring

Few more days to the actual spring, please don't let it be winter. Each day I get a bit more anxious to start outside work. Been

doing a lot of day dreaming as to what all would like to accomplish this spring. the spring flowering bulbs are much to advanced for this time of year, so far they are surviving the cold. I have several showing the flower buds, I keep thinking I should cover them over but would take a lot of covering up, so they are on their own so far as survival.

A group of ladies volunteer at the "Big House" each week and we were discussing some childhood memories of what we did for entertainment and it became quite an conversation of interest. We remembering of those happy evenings especially in spring and summer time when neighborhood kids all gathered to play all those fun games that did not require those unheard of I-phones or computers. We ran races, played hide and seek, tag ball and many just made up games. Most important rule was made by mom's and dad's BE HOME WHEN IT STARTS TO GET DARK. What fun we had running off energy. I think many of us would love for the chance to be able to have some of that fun again, it was cheap entertainment and much fun. One of the really fun times was when mom would make a batch of taffy and we had a taffy pull, that was definitely done outside. Just lots of fun and a sweet treat. I found her recipe in her old cook book that is one of my pride possessions it is pretty well battered and worn, but it is a treasure to me.

It takes 4 cups sugar in fairly large pan, pour 2 cups boiling water the sugar and let set till sugar is dissolved, place lid over and cook several minutes (did not say perhaps 5 minutes) add 3 tablespoon cider vinegar and 2 tablespoon butter cook with lid on until the syrup when spoon full is dropped into cold water and is hardened. Pour onto a buttered tray let cool quickly (this helps the taffy from going to sugar.) When cool enough to handle add a few drops of vanilla or any flavoring you choose and start pulling. Mom divided this up and 2 of us got to pull in pairs. Always pull from the ends and do not press strands together when pulled should have have like air pockets in it, lay out on a tray and when cold break into pieces. Really good and bound to put kids today on a sugar high. Enjoy if you dare to. And keep thinking spring!
