

DIGITAL TELEVISION TRANSITION NOTICE

The nationwide switch to digital television broadcasting will be complete on June 12, 2009, but your local television stations may switch sooner. After the switch, analogonly television sets that receive TV programming through an antenna will need a converter box to continue to receive overthe-air TV. Watch your local stations to find out when they will turn off their analog signal and switch to digital-only broadcasting. Analog-only TVs should



Clell H. Myers, Jr., 87, of Warren, IN, died at 1:06 PM, on Thursday, April 23, 2009 at Lutheran Hospital of Indiana in Fort Wayne, IN.

He was born on

Thursday, October 13, 1921, in Huntington County, IN. Clell was a graduate of Jefferson Township School in Huntington County and was a lifetime resident of the area.

After the start of WWII, he joined the Army Air Corp's Cadet Pilot Program and became a bomber pilot. Clell flew 67 combat missions in the Mediterranean Theater, piloting a Martin Marauder B-26 bomber.

After combat duty, he returned to the states to help instruct a class of bomber pilots. Upon its completion, Clell volunteered and completed helicopter pilot training in the Army Air Corps initial group of rescue helicopter trainees earning his "Egg Beater" license. After being discharged from active duty, Clell remained in the Air Force Reserves until earning his full military retirement on Oct. 13, 1981 at the rank of lieutenant colonel.

Like so many others of that time, Clell was never boastful about his service, but was proud of what he and the other approximately 16 million members of the "Greatest Generation" had accomplished for this country and the world during WW II. They purchased their farm soon after on which they resided until moving into Heritage Pointe, Warren in early 2007.

Clell was self employed as a full time farmer and dairyman until Jan 1984 when he discontinued dairying. He continued to farm with his son for the next 18 years until completely retiring in 2002 at the age of 80. He had attended and was currently associated with Jefferson Center (Solid Rock) Methodist Church and had been an assistant Sunday School instructor in the past.

Clell never lost his affection for aviation and enjoyed going to civilian and military airshows and events throughout his life with his family. He also enjoyed weekend summer camping with his wife for the past 30 years. They especially enjoyed their time at Wildwood Acres Campground at Hartford City for the last 15 seasons of camping.





Mix together crumb topping till crumbly, press half into a 9 inch greased pan. Cover with the rhubarb. In a saucepan combine sugar, water, vanilla, cornstarch - cook stirring till thick and clear. Pour over rhubarb and top with remaining crumbs. Bake at 350 1 hour let cool partially and cut in squares serve warm topped with whipped cream or topping. Have a great spring!
