CIRCUS CELEBRATES 71ST YEAR

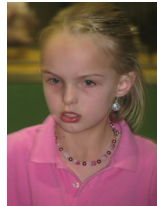

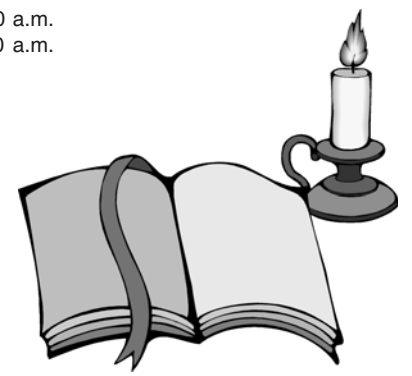



DIGITAL TELEVISION TRANSITION NOTICE



The nationwide switch to digital television broadcasting will be complete on June 12, 2009, but your local television stations may switch sooner. After the switch, analog-only television sets that receive TV programming through an antenna will need a converter box to continue to receive over-the-air TV. Watch your local stations to find out when they will turn off their analog signal and switch to digital-only broadcasting. Analog-only TVs should continue to work as before to receive low power, Class A or translator television stations and with cable and satellite TV services, gaming consoles, VCRs, DVD players, and similar products.

Clell H. Myers, Jr., 87, of Warren, IN, died at 1:06 PM, on Thursday, April 23, 2009 at Lutheran Hospital of Indiana in Fort Wayne, IN.



He was born on Thursday, October 13, 1921, in Huntington County, IN. Clell was a graduate of Jefferson Township School in Huntington County and was a lifetime resident of the area.

After the start of WWII, he joined the Army Air Corp's Cadet Pilot Program and became a bomber pilot. Clell flew 67 combat missions in the Mediterranean Theater, piloting a Martin Marauder B-26 bomber.

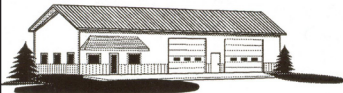

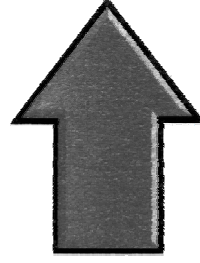

Rhubarb Crunch

For the fruit mixture: 4 cups diced rhubarb, 1 cup sugar, 2 tablespoon cornstarch, 1 cup water 1 teaspoon vanilla, whipped cream or topping.

Mix together crumb topping till crumbly, press half into a 9 inch greased pan. Cover with the rhubarb. In a saucepan combine sugar, water, vanilla, cornstarch - cook stirring till thick and clear. Pour over rhubarb and top with remaining crumbs. Bake at 350 1 hour let cool partially and cut in squares serve warm topped with whipped cream or topping. Have a great spring!
