#### Dutch Mill Sugar Cream Pie


1/2c. brown sugar	2c. heavy shipping cream

1/2c. flour , not level	pinch of salt
1c. milk	½ tsp cinnamon
Combine sugar and flour mix well	Add salt milk and heat till

Fold in heavy whipping cream and vanilla. Pour into unbaked pie shell and sprinkle with cinnamon on top

Bale at 400 degrees still set.




