MY TOWN and Yours BY DENNIS STROUD

The oil wells were a big part of Warren's survival. The first producing oil well in Indiana was drilled on the Bryson farm in Chester Township, Wells County, not far from Keystone, in June 1890. It was one of the best wells as far as long-time production and it created so much excitement in Wells, Blackford, Southern Huntington and Grant Counties. Oil men came running from Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

After the Bryson well was drilled, there was an influx of oil men. Warren was a convenient point for their headquarters, but for awhile it was different for them to find living quarters. There were two small hotels and several families taking in borders but there was always more applicants than there were rooms.

One of the hotels was a big three story wood structure that stood were the hardware store used to be. The building was built by Hiram Gill about the time of the civil war. The last operators of this hotel were Mr. and Mrs. Foreman. He had been a butcher for many years and he and his son, Charles, had a meat market

across the alley where the Pharmacist townhouse is now. Mrs. Foreman was known locally as a good cook and their hotel was always full. The other hotel was up the street, where the Church of Christ now stands, and was run by Mr. and Mrs. Hows.

Next article we will tell what the towns people did about the lodging problem.

fillet. Mix all ingredient except a baking dish and add 2 cups of the marinade. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours. Coat grill rack with non stick spray or use a special rack for fish. Drain salmon and discard the marinade. Place skin side down on grilling rack grill on medium heat for 5 minutes, then baste with the remaining marinade grilling for 7-9 minutes or until salmon flakes. Baste several times while cooking.

TO THE EDITOR

In the April 1st issue of Warren Weekly, Dennis Stroud wrote an article about the history of Cline-Click Lumber Company in his column of "My Town and Yours."

It was later noted that he had very unintentionally forgotten to include Hugh Sills as manager for a period of 20 years with Dean Cassiday as a loyal employee.

However, he also did not include Elbridge Worster as manager for many years until 1984.

He very intentionally left out one person who was employed from early 1977 to the end of 1997. He was there until the final closing in 1998. He was manager for 12 years. That person was none other than himself, Dennis Stroud.

During those years he served as vice-president of the Salamonie Area Historical Society. When it disbanded he had become interested in the history of Warren and the surrounding areas. It was at that time that he founded the Salamonie Valley Museum within the Civic Center. He has been the curator up until the present time.

During those years he has been a big part of the town of Warren.

Among his community affiliations have been: A member of the board of directors of the Civic Center for many years and president for 12 years, as secretary of the Warren Redevelopment Board, Salamonie Summer Festival chairman for two years and parade chairman for 10 years. While in this capacity

they started Stage II. First it was a hay wagon, then two wagons were pulled together. Neither were sturdy enough to use for the many activities and dances. Denny and Howard Penrod were appointed to make a new stage. They constructed the stage by nailing the plywood panels and 2x4's together to make the stage floor but couldn't design the right type of legs to support it. They finally used the saw horse brackets which have worked until this time (I think).

He was present of Warren Jaycees, Warren Sportsman Club, Coach in the Warren Baseball League and Girls Softball League for 25 years, leader of a cubscout troop for five years. He also organized the Civic Center Basketball League. He is a Vietnam veteran which afforded him the privilege of serving as Commander of the Warren Charles S Beard Post #183 of American Legion. He was treasurer of the Salamonie Valley Jim Beam Bottle and Specialty Club when it was popular in this area.

As president of the Civic Center board, he was the contact person with Mr Clifford Knight when he donated the large sum of money to establish the Knight Civic Center in his name to preserve the Warren High School from which he had graduated in 1921.

He was the contact person who worked closely with the administrators of Southern Wells School after their tragic fire in December 1993. He assisted them with the heating system, clearing the building

of all contents, in the cleaning and painting of the entire building and relocating of the classrooms due to his knowledge of the building.

He was also responsible for all the Christmas lighting and displays at the Civic Center for 14 years with the help of board members, his two brothers, Dale and Dan Stroud, and friends. In the last few years he and his young sons Kevin (Mr Light Man) and Kyle (Mr Runner Man) did it mostly by themselves. This brought much enjoyment to the community and surrounding areas.

Yes, he also managed the Cline-Click Lumber yard with much efficiency with his help from Mike Bowling and Ferol DeWeese.

He was the proud winner of the Samuel Jones Pioneer Award winner in 1998.

Denny is the son of Harry and Patricia Stroud, both deceased. He is a life long resident of the Town of Warren and a member of the Warren United Church of Christ.

Denny and his wife, Marcia (Shideler) Stroud are the parents of Kimberlee Stroud, Kevin (Aimee) Stroud of Decatur and Kyle (Amy) Stroud of Huntington, and new grandparents to Ella Marie and Logan Michael Stoud. Without them, he could not have accomplished all of these many tasks.
