SUMMER BAND & CHORAL

Plans have been released for the 2017 4-H Band Workshop and the Youth Choral Workshop at Purdue University this summer.

The Indiana State 4-H Band Workshop will be held June 24-26 on the campus of Purdue University. Purdue Assistant Professor of Bands, Matthew Conaway, will be serving at the main conductor. The band will perform June 26, 6:30 PM for 4-H Round-up participants and parents.

Participants are selected by their application and must have the recommendation of their instrumental/band instructor.

The 2017 Youth Choral Workshop is a four day workshop which concludes with a public performance on June 27. The workshop will be held June 24-27 on the Purdue University Campus. The chorus will also perform at the Indiana State Fair on August 11 and 12.

4-H organizes and sponsors the chorus along with the Indiana State Fair.

Youth should complete an application and obtain a recommendation of a vocal and/or choral instructor.

Registration cost for the band is \$180 and the chorus is

\$250. Partial sponsorship is available from Wells County 4-H. Call 824-6412 for information and details.

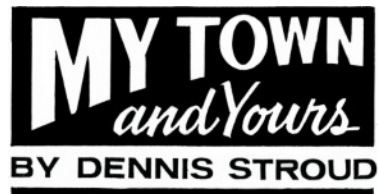

On December 12, 1992, Southern Wells Elementary School caught fire and burnt down. Warren, Inc. board members offered their building to Southern Wells to house their children until they could build a new building.

On December 19, volunteers from the Warren community helped vacate the entire building. People who had rented rooms found other facilities. Party reservations were moved somewhere else. The Museum that was on the second floor, at that time, was boxed up and put in storage.

On Monday December, 21 volunteers from the Southern Wells community,

arrived to the ready the building for their children. Donations of paint, school furnishings and material began coming from areas far from the two communities. On January 4, the building was ready for the first bus load of kids.

For their efforts, the communities of Warren and Southern Wells was given the 1992-93 Midland Community Spirit Award which honors a community that has pulled together to overcome a major problem. This award was developed by residents of Midland, Texas after the 1987 rescue of 18-month-old Jessica McClure from an abandoned water well. We were chosen from 130 entries across the United States.

I mention this, about Southern Wells, because it not only helped them out, in a time of need, but was a turning point in the civic center history. Our building was in need of repairs, at the time, and our finances were low. By letting Southern Wells in, the rooms were painted, carpet on the floors and other things repaired. More next time.

Many parents educate their children about the dangers of drugs and alcohol, but there are other substances that are often forgotten in these discussions: inhalants.

Inhalant abuse, or huffing, refers to the deliberate sniffing of common products found in homes and communities with the sole purpose of "getting high." These products include: correction fluid; air conditioning coolant; gasoline; propane; felt tip markers; spray paint; air

freshener; butane; cooking spray; and glue. According to the American Association of Pediatrics, nearly 20% of all eighth graders have experimented with some form of inhalant.

This statistic is alarming because when intentionally misused, inhalants are so dangerous that "sudden sniffing death" can result after a single inhalant use. Over the past six years, more than 800 deaths have been linked to inhalant abuse. Inhalants are addictive and considered to be "gateway" drugs because children often progress from inhalants to illegal drug and alcohol abuse.

After the use of an inhalant, a user may feel slightly stimulated. Repeated inhalations make them feel less inhibited and less in control. If use continues, users can lose consciousness. High concentration of inhalants can cause death from suffocation by displacing oxygen in the lungs and then in the central nervous system so that breathing stops. Deliberately inhaling from a bag greatly increases the chances of suffocation. Chronic abuse of inhalants can cause severe long-term damage to the brain, the liver, and the

kidneys. Other effects include: hearing loss; limb spasms; bone marrow damage; and blood oxygen depletion.

Inhalants are sometimes thought of as substances abused by middle school students. Although that is often the case, it isn't always:

Charles Keegan Stroud, a fun-loving 14 year old, watched a classmate huff computer duster he stole from the teacher's desk. He said it was no different than sucking helium from a balloon. Charlie tried it at home, and his best friend found him dead minutes later.

Lisa Doughty, age 30, left behind her two sons, age four and nine, her brother, other family, and a host of friends, when she died from huffing.

Matt Young was inhaling refrigerant as young teen but stopped when he was shown that it can be deadly. Later, he inhaled gasoline daily for several months. At age 21, Matt was found dead on a neighbor's air conditioning unit.

Ashley Long had just turned 14 when doctors told her parents that she had inhaled helium, which caused asphyxiation resulting in death.

David Manlove, age 16, discovered he could get high by inhaling the propellant from computer duster and the chemical would not show up on drug screens administered by the treatment facility he attended. David died due to huffing.

Children think that "if it's in the house, it can't be that dangerous." They see huffing in movies and on television, or portrayed as harmless and funny on YouTube. But we need to teach children that inhaling is not "harmless." It is a very real game of Russian roulette.

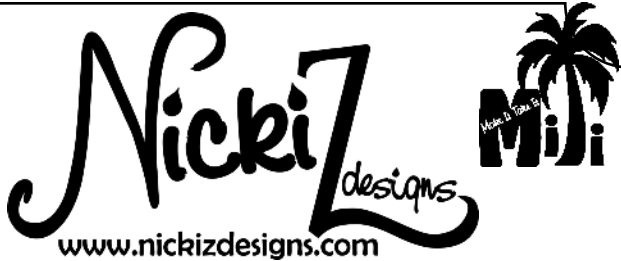
