KUDOS, KICKS & KARATS

DEAR FRIENDS,

When you think back to your teen years, what do you remember? Is it Friday night football games, the prom, concerts? Perhaps it was when you were learning how to drive or maybe your first "love". For most of us, we may not want to be an adolescent again but we do have happy memories.

Adolescence in itself is a very challenging time, even in the best circumstances. Too often young people do not know where they are going to sleep at night and find themselves bouncing from home to home, couch to couch without a stable place to call home. There are many young people in Huntington going hungry on a daily basis. If this isn't enough, many young people are also dealing with complex issues such as drug and/or alcohol abuse, mental health issues, family dysfunction and even thoughts of suicide.

The Youth Services Bureau's mission is to provide quality, comprehensive, empowering programs and services to assist youth and families as they encounter the challenges associated with childhood, adolescence and early adulthood. The agency offers seventeen different programs to help meet the needs of Huntington County's youth and families. However, we cannot do this without the caring support from people like you!

In 2013, we were able to assist over 3,200 people. A 16 year old who participated in one of our programs shared, "I didn't want to be around people and didn't know how to handle things. I often got into trouble because of this. But now I am coping better and am more confident. I have not gotten into trouble since I left YSB."

A parent stated, "We were stuck, wrapped up in life. I didn't have the skills to help myself or my children. I am not sure where our family would be without the support we received from YSB." It is families like these that make YSB essential to the community.

This year's "Making a Difference" fund drive is underway. The goal for this year is \$15,000. Examples of how your tax deductible gift will help:

- \$25 will ensure a student will have the school supplies he/she needs
 - \$50 will provide a cooking class for middle school and high school students involved with the Students Out of School program
 - \$60 will provide an infant a safe, age-appropriate child car seat along with proper installation
 - \$75 will provide five suicide prevention posters with informational cards to be displayed throughout Huntington County
 - \$100 will provide an entire seventh grade class with suicide prevention education
 - \$200 will provide an adult community suicide prevention training

### STD AWARENESS

April is STD Awareness Month and State health officials encourage Hoosiers to understand how sexually-transmitted diseases (STDs) can damage overall health. STD Awareness Month provides an opportunity for individuals and groups to discuss prevention and testing for STDs, especially for Indiana's youth. Half of all new sexually transmitted infections that occur each year are among youths.

"Prevention means not only protecting yourself from becoming infected with an STD, but also not passing on an STD to another," said State Health Commissioner William VanNess, M.D. "Talk to your healthcare provider and

know your status."

Sexually transmitted diseases can be spread through vaginal, anal and oral sex, or may be passed from mother to baby before, during or after birth. An STD like syphilis can cross the placenta and infect the baby. Pregnant women with an STD could experience:

- Premature labor or rupture of the membranes
- Stillbirth
- Low birth weight
- Preterm birth

In Indiana, Chlamydia continues to be the most frequently reported sexually transmitted disease in the state with 29,505 cases reported in 2012. Unfortunately, most people who have Chlamydia may not have symptoms and do not realize they are infected.

Gonorrhea is the second most commonly reported bacterial STD in Indiana and the United States, and is most often found in 15-24 year old population. In 2012, there were 7,338 cases of gonorrhea reported in Indiana. The complications of untreated Chlamydia and gonorrhea include pelvic inflammatory disease, infertility and ectopic pregnancy.

Syphilis can cause long term complications if not adequately treated and often symptoms may go unnoticed in the primary stage. Syphilis must be diagnosed through a blood test. In 2012, there were 224 cases of primary and secondary syphilis reported in Indiana.

People can protect themselves by abstaining from sex, being in a long-term mutually monogamous relationship with a partner who has been tested and has negative STD test results and consistent and correct use of latex condoms. Vaccination is also very important to protect yourself from hepatitis B and Human Papillomavirus (HPV).

### EIGHT TIPS TO GET YOUR LAWN MOWER READY FOR SPRING

(BPT) - With spring just around the corner, now is the perfect time to tune up your lawn mower for the season ahead. A yearly tune-up is important to ensure all parts of your mower are functioning properly and safely. Use these eight tips to rev up your engine and get your mower ready for spring:

1. Read the operator's manual. Before operating your lawn mower, always read the operator's manual in its entirety to ensure safe and proper use of the equipment. Also be sure you understand and follow all instructions and are familiar with all the controls and functions. It's best to keep your manual in a safe place in case you need to reference it at any time.
2. Check your fuel. Fuel can go bad in as little as 30 days and bad fuel can result in a sputtering engine or prevent the mower from turning over. If the fuel has a strange odor or has become thick and viscous, it's best to drain it. Once you've drained the gas, fill the tank with fresh fuel. Check your operator's manual for information on the right fuel type for your mower as using improper fuel can damage your equipment.
3. Lubricate the throttle and

moving parts. Leftover grease and oil can harden while your mower sits during the winter. To help loosen the hardened oil, apply a light lubricant on the narrow spring of the throttle. If you have a mower with adjustable heights, like Yard Machines' 21-inch high wheel 3-in-1 push mower, make sure to lubricate the lever, as well as any other moving parts.

4. Clean the air filter. Air filters shield your engine from dirt and can easily become clogged with oil and debris. This can prevent oxygen from entering the engine, resulting in coughs and sputters. It's recommended you replace your air filter every season for best engine performance. To clean a washable foam filter, soak it in warm, soapy water and squeeze it dry. If your unit uses a cardboard or paper filter, simply replace it.

5. Check and change the oil. Always check the oil level before using your mower, and be sure to change the oil filter and add new oil after using your mower for about five to eight hours. Running a motor on low oil can lead to low compression and can burn out the engine. Overfilling, however, can damage the seals. In this case, remove the oil plug, drain the old oil and refill the engine with the oil amount and type indicated in your operator's manual.

6. Install a new spark plug. Spark plugs are inexpensive and should be replaced once a season. Over time, they can become rusted and corroded, and a fouled or corroded plug won't spark at all. Remember to always remove the spark plug wire before servicing. When removing the old one, check the spark plug cable for signs of damage or rust. Do not clean or reuse old spark

plugs.

7. Inspect blades. A dull blade will cause grass tips to turn brown, and weakened grass blades are prone to pests and disease. If your blades are bent or dull, replace them with new blades to deliver a clean cut, optimum performance, increased life for your equipment and professional-looking results for your lawn. However, always replace parts with original equipment manufacturer (OEM) pieces that are specifically made for your machine to maximize performance and results.

8. Replace the belt or battery. Always be sure to clean any debris, leaves or grass clippings from under the deck to prevent rust and corrosion. If you own a self-propelled unit and the belt is heavily worn or shows signs of cracking, replace it immediately. If you have a unit with an electric start, however, make sure your battery didn't drain over the winter. Check your operator's manual for specific instructions for charging or replacing your battery.

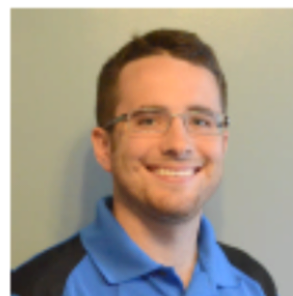
