WHEN IT'S TIME TO TAKE ACTION

from the American Counseling Association
 Most of us have few hesitations about taking actions to correct life's small problems. We might complain about poor restaurant service, return yesterday's defective purchase, or visit our doctor about a troubling health issue.

But are we are ready and willing to take action when the problem we're facing turns out to be the actual life we're living?

Too often our response to real life issues and disappointments is to simply push them aside, or to feel sorry and depressed that things aren't going right. Unfortunately, allowing yourself to wallow in anger or blame or feelings of helplessness when life isn't giving you all you expect from it, doesn't fix anything. Instead, you need to turn such feelings into positive energy to help in building the better life you desire.

A starting point is simply sitting down with yourself and identifying what things have you feeling that your life isn't working out the way you once planned. While the realities of daily living often take a toll on the optimistic visions we all once had, you need not surrender totally to the problems and shortcomings you face.

Instead, you can begin to take small steps toward living the life you really want. One step is simply finding your own voice. It's necessary to be able to express your feelings when things are disappointing you. Speaking up doesn't mean that you're being selfish or overbearing. You simply want to be honest and to have others better understand what's troubling you.

If the demands of an overly-busy schedule don't leave you time for people and events that would make you feel more positive about your life, learn to say, "No" when necessary. Your aim should be for the changes, even small ones, that help you move toward the life you want.

Identify your strengths and interests and then put time into nourishing them. Begin by taking one daily action that moves you closer to your desired life. It can be something simple, like rewriting your resume, cleaning out old files or a cluttered closet, or reconnecting with an old friend.

Your goal is to create an overall balance in your life. A life that is too busy often ends up without room for those people and activities that can help you better connect with the real you and the life you feel you should be living.

SCHOOL BOARD

APPROVAL

The HCCSC Board of School Trustees approved Curricular Material fees for the 2020-2021 school year at their meeting on February 24, 2020.

For the 2020-2021 school year, there will be a change in technology devices for students in grades 6-12. HCCSC has decided to go with a Dell Latitude laptop with an 11" screen for middle and high school students. "The decision to recommend a device platform change was not taken lightly. HCCSC wanted to value all the hard work teachers have completed to develop instructional content for their students. The new student device will have double the memory than the current student device. The decision to change devices will also be a significant benefit for our families," commented Tom Ashley, Director of Technology. Although Curricular Material Fees vary from student to student (depending on the courses they take), a sampling of a typical 6th grade student shows a

savings of \$101.00 from the 2019-2020 school year. The technology instructional fee has been reduced from \$175 to \$84.00 for the 2020-21 school year. Scott Bumgardner, Business Manager explains, "Our goal was to provide a quality product for our students while lessening the financial impact on our families."

"HCCSC will save \$1.1 million dollars over a four-year period going with a different student device at the middle school and high school. We feel that this is the most cost effective option while still being able to meet the needs of all students in the district," commented Superintendent Chad Daugherty.

HCCSC will hold a Kindergarten Fair for all children in Huntington County who will turn 5 years old on or before October 1st. This year's theme is "Kinder Garden".

The event will be held at Huntington North High School on Thursday March, 12, 2020 beginning at 6:00 p.m. *Enter through Door #28.

Parents are encouraged to bring their child's birth certificate, immunization records, and proof of residency to aid in the registration process.

The evening will begin for incoming kinders and their families in the auditorium where they will hear a brief word of welcome from Superintendent Chad Daugherty and Mr. Jay Peters, Director of Curriculum. The HCCSC Corporation Nurse Meg Friesen, RN, BSN, will speak about immunizations, and other health-related topics.

Those in attendance will be dismissed to the fieldhouse where they will have access to our community partners including dental/ vision/ hearing, immunizations, childcare, etc. They will be able to take a ride on a school bus, talk to representatives from our Transportation and Food Service departments, and have their photo taken for PowerSchool.

A Kindergarten Survey is available for parents to complete is available on our website (www.hccsc.k12.in.us) as well as the HCCSC Facebook page. Incoming students will receive a personalized invitation to our event once that

information has been entered.

SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

Three Parkview Huntington Hospital (PHH) nurses – two of them pursuing master's degrees – have been awarded Jill Dreyer scholarships for the spring 2020 semester.

Justin Asher, Sandra Martinez and Angela Troyer each received \$1,000 toward their education costs for the current academic semester.

The awards were announced by Mike Perkins, director of the Parkview Huntington Foundation, which administers the Jill Dreyer Scholarship funds.

"The Jill Dreyer Scholarship program demonstrates the vision and thoughtful investment of Parkview Huntington Hospital co-workers and members of the community the hospital serves," Perkins said. "It is funded by gifts from co-workers during the foundation's annual Employee Generosity Campaign as well as by proceeds from community events presented by the foundation and the hospital."

Asher, who is from Huntington, is a registered nurse (RN) and a nursing supervisor at the hospital. He has been a nurse at PHH for the past decade, and has been awarded the Jill Dreyer Scholarship four times since 2014. Asher is enrolled at Indiana Wesleyan University, working toward a master's degree in nursing and a nurse practitioner certification.

Martinez, a resident of Monroe, is a certified nursing assistant and an emergency care technician in PHH's Emergency Department, having been part of the hospital team all three years of her nursing career. She is

pursuing an associate degree in nursing at the University of Saint Francis.

Troyer, also of Huntington, is an RN in the hospital's Family Birthing Center. She also received the Jill Dreyer Scholarship for the spring 2019 semester. Troyer is working toward her master's degree in nursing, as well as her nurse practitioner certification, at Goshen College. She has spent the past five and a half years of her 20-year nursing career at PHH.

The scholarship program was established in 2004 in memory of the late Jill Dreyer, a PHH nurse. It provides as many as six scholarships each year to full- and part-time PHH co-workers pursuing a nursing education. It also is used to reimburse qualified candidates for fees incurred taking their final examinations for various nursing certifications. A

committee of PHH nurses reviews the scholarship applications and selects the recipients.

Since its inception, the Jill Dreyer Scholarship program has provided \$40,000 in assistance to hospital co-workers.

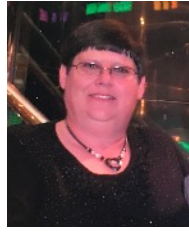
